Nokia 360-degree cameras and VR technology provide students with the perspective of being in a wheelchair. This story of inclusion unfolds in a high school, after the arrival of two sisters with muscular dystrophy prompts an extracurricular wheelchair basketball program.



Un/ried Shoes
An online shoe catalogue provides a metaphor for the fashion challenges of self-expression for genderqueer people. Poignant examples of the lifelong barriers to adequate clothing faced by trans and non-binary people are categorized by shoe style.



Legacies 150
Legacies 150 comprises 13 interactive stories created by a geographically and socially diverse group of Canadians, featuring captivating animation, photography and sound. Commemorating Canada 150 years after confederation, the collection provides students access to broad experiences, histories and places.



Highrise: Universe Within
Composed of nine vignettes, Highrise: Universe Within explains the increase in human connectivity enabled by technological advances such as the Internet and AI. These portraits of individuals and families allow viewers to consider perspectives influenced by illness, incarceration, and poverty.



Bear 71
An interactive documentary that blends raw video footage with ingenious storytelling to investigate our complex relationship with wildlife. Winner of the FWAs Site of the Year Award for 2012.



Do Not Track
Viewers gain awareness of the consequences of publishing personal information in online platforms. Students interact with this compelling documentary by entering data, while the history and economics of the Internet are explained and net safety tips are provided.



How to Create a Financial Crisis
This interactive doc explores how mortgages work and what kinds of risks are involved in taking out a loan, while profiling the players in an economic system who draw on arcane financial theories to take advantage of ordinary citizens.



Roxham
In this immersive narrative, the user feels the stress experienced by asylum seekers trying to enter Canada. The detached tone of RCMP officers, unwavering in the face of migrants' distress, offers a resonant metaphor for current crises and conflicts.
