

Power of Sector-Wide Procurement

Relationships That Deliver Value

With supply chain issues periodically impacting the availability of products the sector relies on, Focused ED has been strengthening and drawing on our relationships with suppliers to anticipate shortages and find options for solutions, so districts and schools can meet their needs with limited disruption. As well, our strong supplier relationships provide the sector with preferred access to new products and technologies, value-adds, and price-optimized agreements for high-quality products.

Info Hours

The Procurement team hosted spring and fall Info Hour virtual sessions to keep members informed about the status of supplier agreements, the global supply chain and new initiatives. The two fall sessions hosted 63 members and focused on Natural Gas and Energy Management, the End-User Computing Devices Request for Proposals, the IT Professional Services

Roster, and our 2023 Roadmap.
In the spring, we hosted two
sessions which together
welcomed 56 members. One
session focused on Zoom,
while the other introduced the
successful suppliers for End-User
Computing Devices and the IT
Professional Services Roster.

Procurement Templates

While districts and schools often have individual procurement needs that arise during the course of day-to-day operations, they can have varying capacity to undertake that process. To help, Focused ED introduced a 12-piece suite of procurement documents, templates, and guides to help make the process easier. Vetted by legal counsel, these resources include a Procurement Policy, Procurement Manual and Negotiated Request for Proposals templates.

Member Connections: BCASBO

We were pleased to take part in this year's BC Association of School Business Officials' (BCASBO) AGM and conference in May. In addition to in-person member connections, we provided a presentation on public-sector procurement, which also addressed the driving factors behind changing needs and how to be proactively responsive to them.

PROCUREMENT...BY THE NUMBERS

Ever wondered about the impact of collective procurement? Below are just a few of Focused ED members' purchases this year.

\$10.54 million

in Computing Devices were purchased across 35 districts. In total, 12,673 devices were acquired, including 10,978 laptops and 1,695 desktops.

\$5.76 million

in Office Supplies across
43 districts. Among many others this
included 277,202 whiteboard dry
erase markers and
79,627 pencil erasers.

\$3.17 million

in Copy Paper, across 33 districts.
Together, participating districts purchased significant quantities of common sizes, such as 295.4 million sheets of 8-1/2 x 11 paper, enough to create a stack four times higher than Mount Everest.

\$2.51 million

in Custodial Supplies, across 24 districts.
Paper hand towels are just one of
many supplies purchased:
70.2 million singlefold sheets,
enough to create a stack 38 kms
high, equal to the distance from
Penticton to Peachland.

Anti-Racism Resources

As part of our work to identify and fill gaps in antiracism learning resources, Focused ED, guided by an Advisory Committee with lived experience, initiated a project with Open School BC to develop an online Black Canadian Learning Resource for classroom use. With input from BCTF-appointed educators and administrators, the resource is in development with mid-fall 2024 launch target.

Live It Earth

Starting in September 2022, all K-7 English and French teachers were able to access this Canadian-created online resource. Informed by Indigenous perspectives, the Live It Earth suite focuses on cross-curricular programming and is supplemented by instructional supports. With new projects introduced throughout the school year, teachers and students can participate in a live streaming launch to ask questions of experts. In the past year, one especially meaningful project focused on Chief Kw'eh of the Nak'azdi Whut'en non-treaty First Nation from BC.

To support districts in meeting the enhanced privacy legislation announced by the BC Government in February, Focused ED has been developing a suite of resources to make it easier for districts to navigate the recommendations and ensure best practices. This resource collection will be available to members by the end of 2023.

On November 17 and 18, 2022, Focused ED welcomed 369 members, partners and exhibitors to take part in IT4K12. As it was the first time an in-person gathering had been possible for two years, virtual attendance was also offered. At 304 people, in-person participation was strongly favoured, with 96% of attendees finding sessions that actively applied to their areas of responsibility.

Due Diligence Workshop

The 2023 workshop welcomed 139 attendees, with 98 from school districts, 36 from independent schools, and five from partners and BC's provincial government. This year's sessions focused on privacy topics: developing Privacy Impact Assessments; building a data privacy and security framework; meeting compliance requirements and maintaining appropriate security measures in day-to-day work; and delivering staff training.


