

GALE Power Search Tips Using Topic Finder

Topic Finder is a quick visual tool that interprets a search term and offers connections and relationships between related topics. Each segment of the wheel or tile, when clicked, generates articles from the GALE databases.

SEARCH TOPIC FINDER

Enter search term. Choose Tiles or Wheel visualization.

There are two ways to visualize below which words and subjects are found most often in the text of your search results. Visualization: Tiles Wheel	RESULTS Clicking on a topic wheel or tile narrows your original search results to the documents also containing that subject or term. CREATING MINI-LESSONS WITH TOPIC FINDER

Compare the same search term across the different databases. This will require searching the term within each of the following databases: Science in Context, Canada in Context, and Global Issues in Context. Once you search, scroll to locate Topic Finder on the bottom right-hand side. Launching this will enable to you to select the tile or wheel view. View results in each of the three databases.

Create an instant conversation about opinion, without the negative connotation of bias, and encourage a strategic approach to research. Support students to understand the value of narrowing focus, as opposed to the massive returns of a Google Search.

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
